**Special Remarks on other Toxic Effects on Humans:**

Phenyltoloxamine Citrate is a sedating antihistamine. Potential Health Effects: Skin: May cause skin irritation. Eyes: May cause eye irritation. Inhalation: May cause respiratory tract irritation. Ingestion: May be harmful if swallowed. Can cause nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, epigastric pain, loss of appetite. The most common effect of sedating antihistamines is central nervous system depression. Symptoms may include lightheadedness, dizziness, headache, slight drowsiness to deep sleep, agitation, anxiety, hallucinations, lassitude, somnolence, incoordination, sleep disturbances, confusion, convulsions, tremors. Other effects that have been reported with antihistamines include psychomotor impairment, excitation, mydriasis, mouth and throat dryness, nasal dryness and stuffiness, thickened respiratory tract secretions, blurred vision, urinary difficulty or retention, constipation, sweating, myalgia, paraesthesias, tinnitus, liver effects (jaundice, hepatitis), cholestasis, increased gastric reflux, and hairloss. Cardiovascular effects such as hypotension or hypertension, heart palpitations/tachycardia, and arrhythmias may rarely occur. Antihistamines in general may sometimes cause rashes and hypersensitivity reactions (including bronchospasm, anaphylaxis, angioedema). Blood disorders, including agranulocytosis, leucopenia, hemolytic anemia, and thrombocytopenia, although rare, may occur. Medical Conditions Aggravated by Exposure: Hypersensitization.
